PRIVACY AND COOKIES

Voice for Justice UK treats the privacy of its supporters and others very seriously and we take appropriate measures to safeguard their personal data*. This notice explains how we collect, use, protect and share personal data.

*Personal data means any information that may be used to identify an individual, including, but not limited to, a first and last name, a home or other physical address and an email address or other contact information.

Voice for Justice UK

VfJUK is a not-for-profit organization set up to protect and defend the rights to freedom of belief and speech, and to speak out for those who are abused, exploited or oppressed and cannot speak for themselves. We work especially to defend the rights of children and of the family.

VfJUK is a company limited by guarantee (No. 8341200). The company is registered in England with its registered office at 3-4 Blackworth Court, Blackworth Industrial Estate, Highworth, SN6 7NS.

ParentPower

ParentPower is a website administered by VfJUK in cooperation with other contributing groups and individuals with expert knowledge of areas related to education, child development, and the family. It is designed to provide up to date information on educational issues and developments affecting the development and wellbeing of children, as well as offering advice and support on current law. It is designed to give parents a voice, empowering them to protect children and ensuring the provision of education in line with their religious and/or philosophical beliefs. It also provides a Forum for which users of the site, if they wish to participate, are required to register. Those who are so registered can raise and discuss issues of concern with others, share experiences, or ask for help.

OVERVIEW

We collect personal information from:

- supporters and those who have contact with us
- our volunteers
- donors when they make a donation

We use personal information to:

- keep in touch with our supporters
- carry out reasonable administration of our mailings, donations, and volunteering
- manage enquiries
- improve communication with our supporters

We also collect data relating to use of our website.

HOW WE OBTAIN PERSONAL INFORMATION

INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE DATA SUBJECT:

Those who have joined our mailing list have indicated support for our aims and are categorised as our supporters. They have given us their details and asked to be kept informed; either in signing one of our petitions, or by subsequently signing up to receive our mailings.

The information provided to us will include some or all of the following:

- name and title
- email address
- country they live in (if outside the UK)

We also collect the following information:

- address including postcode on occasion
- telephone number on occasion, e.g. if a supporter contacts us and volunteers their number
- amount and frequency (if giving regularly) of donation, and partial bank details of donor (but not sufficient to effect a transaction)
- information about our relationship with supporters and those who contact us
- some of our supporters volunteer or specific activities. Our volunteers provide us with their name, title, contact details, occupation and references.

INFORMATION WE GET FROM OTHER SOURCES

We sometimes use legal and publically available sources to obtain information.

For example:

- a telephone number for someone on our mailing list if we have cause to contact them and do not already have a number
- to ensure that existing supporter contact details are up to date

HOW WE USE PERSONAL INFORMATION

We use personal information to:

- administer mailings to our supporters, to keep them informed
- manage enquiries from supporters and those who contact us and keep a record of contact and correspondence

- manage our volunteers and provide or administer activities for them
- administer donations, thank donors, and maintain our accounts and records
- improve our communications and opportunities

We endeavor to keep personal information up to date. This includes monitoring returned mail to let us know if a person no longer lives at the address we hold for them.

If a person applies to work for us, their personal information will only be processed for the purposes of recruitment and processing their application. Applicant information is kept for six months after completion of the recruitment process.

OUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- We only send electronic mailings about our work and aims to those who have given their consent to us to do so. However, a person can change their mind and withdraw their consent at any time. Every email has a link to enable the recipient to unsubscribe if they wish to stop receiving emails.
- In all other cases the law allows us to hold and process the personal information of supporters and others if it is in our legitimate interests to do so. We rely on our legitimate interests to maintain our mailing list, administer our donations, and keep appropriate records. Relying on our legitimate interests means that we carry out an exercise to check that we will not cause harm to the data subject by processing their personal information, that the processing is not overly intrusive and that we will only do so in a way which is described in this notice. Our legitimate interests involve furthering our object of promoting and defending the rights to freedom of belief and of speech, and of defending the rights of children and the family.

TELEPHONE CALLS

Where we use publically available sources to obtain telephone numbers for supporters who have not provided us with this information, we do not contact anyone who subscribes to the Telephone Preference Scheme (TPS). However, if a person has consented to us telephoning them, we will contact them even if they subscribe to the TPS.

SECURITY

We keep personal information secure with appropriate security measures in place to guard against the loss, misuse, and alteration of personal information. We use secure server software to encrypt financial and personal information we collect online.

However, the transmission of data across the internet is not completely secure. We cannot guarantee that loss, misuse or alteration of data will not occur whilst being transferred.

SHARING INFORMATION

We will not share the personal information we hold with another organisation for their own purposes, and we will never sell personal information for any reason whatsoever.

There are a few situations where our legitimate interests involve us using service providers whom we have contracted to fulfil specific services for us. For example, administering our mailings to our supporters involves certain functions being provided by service providers who process on our behalf the name and address details on our mailing list.

We currently use MailChimp to deliver to our supporters the emails they have signed up to receive. Where this is the case, we remain in control of the information and the service provider is not allowed to do anything with the information other than what we have requested. The service also enables us to gather statistics around email opening and clicks using industry standard technologies including gifs to help us monitor and improve our mailings. Donations made through our website are processed by PayPal or by Direct Debit or Standing Order to our account.

WORLDWIDE TRANSFER OF DATA

If it is ever desirable to transfer data outside of the European Economic Area, we ensure that robust data-sharing agreements are in place. For example, MailChimp hosts its data in the US, but it has certified its compliance with the EU-US Privacy Shield Framework.

HOW LONG WE KEEP DATA

Our relationship with our supporters and donors is generally long term, so we keep their personal information for as long as we need it to maintain that relationship or keeping the information is necessary. We take into account our need to meet any legal and regulatory obligations. These reasons vary from one piece of information to another. For example, we are required to keep information relating to donations for seven years.

When we no longer need the information, we will dispose of it securely, using specialist companies to do this work for us if necessary.

COOKIES

WHAT ARE COOKIES?

Cookies are small text files that are downloaded to a user's device when they visit a website.

WHY DO WE USE COOKIES?

We use cookies for the operation, security, monitoring and improvement of our website.

Some cookies are retained in a user's browser for only as long as they visit our website, while others may persist for a longer specified or unspecified period.

SUMMARY OF COOKIES WE USE

In the course of a person's visit to our website third-parties providing services on our website or having content embedded in our website may also place cookies on a user's device to enable the functionality of their services and for their own purposes. We do not control how these third parties use cookies so our website users should refer to the third party's own privacy and cookie policy. HOW DO I CHANGE MY COOKIE SETTINGS?

Our website users can delete cookies or instruct their web browser to delete or refuse cookies. However, if a website user deletes cookies or refuses to accept them, they might not be able to use all of the features we offer, they may not be able to store their preferences, and some of our website pages might not display properly.

IP ADDRESSES

We collect the request made by a user's browser to the server hosting this website. This includes the IP address, the date and time of connection and the page selected. We have legitimate interests in using this information to ensure the security of our website, for system administration and to inform improvements to the website.

SUBJECT ACCESS RIGHTS

A person has certain rights under existing data protection law including the right to request in writing a copy of the personal information we hold about them. From 25 May 2018 a person will have the following rights unless an exemption applies:

RIGHT TO ACCESS

A person has the right to access the personal information that we hold about them. We shall respond promptly, and certainly within one month from the point of receiving a subject access request and all necessary information.

RIGHT TO CORRECT

A person has the right to obtain from us, without undue delay, the rectification of inaccurate or incomplete personal information we hold concerning them.

RIGHT TO ERASE

A person has the right to ask us to erase their personal information without undue delay.

RIGHT TO RESTRICTION OF PROCESSING

In certain circumstances, a person has the right to restrict us from processing their personal information.

RIGHT TO OBJECT

The right to object to our use of their personal information including where we use it on the basis of our legitimate interests. We shall no longer process a person's personal information unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing.

ACCURACY OF INFORMATION

We undertake to the best of our ability to keep information about our supporters and others as up to date and accurate as possible. Our supporters can help us by informing us of any changes to their details when they occur.
